An Economic Summit, hosted by Rep. Paul Clymer, Tom Skiffington of RE/MAX 440 Realty, Pennridge Chamber of Commerce, Upper Bucks Chamber of Commerce, and Pennridge-Perkasie Rotary Club was held at Revivals Restaurant on January 29 for business and community leaders.

Business Coach Karen Daly Smith of Action Coach stressed the importance of business basics and remaining optimistic in this difficult economic time. Bob Cormack, executive director of Bucks County Economic Development Corp. stated that Bucks County is made up of businesses of all sizes with small companies as important to the local economy as big businesses. Tom Skiffington informed the audience that now is one of the best times to purchase a home in the past 20-30 years. Bruce Allen of A&T Chevrolet said that although the past four or five months have been tough ones, January 2009 sales at his car dealership surpassed sales in January of 2008. Grand View Hospital continues to grow, build and hire more staff, according to Maricarol Morley, the hospital's division manager for planning and marketing. Dave Beck, Vice President of The Weimer Group stressed the importance of customer service and stated that insurance premiums have decreased. First Savings Bank of Perkasie's President and CEO Fred Schea affirmed that FSB has never engaged in the kinds of risky behavior that landed the bigger financial institutions in their current predicament. Steve Chadwick, President and CEO of Prodesco/Secant Medical stated that his specialty business has been resistant to the economy. Chamber Executive Director and Bucks County Community College Board Chair Betty Graver discussed the offer of free tuition to people who have been laid off from their jobs and the growing enrollment at the college. Ways to conserve energy and cut electric costs are being offered by PPL Electric Utilities, according to Kathy Frazier. Brad Mulkern of Keybrick Information Systems, Inc. feels businesses should be positioning themselves now for the inevitable recovery and plan for three to five years from now.

Rep. Clymer concluded from what was presented tonight, "this was uplifting."

Update Regarding Card Check Legislation

The Government Affairs Committee of the Pennridge Chamber of Commerce made a recommendation to the Board of Directors to partner with the Pennsylvania State Chamber. The Board was asked to consider signing a letter that will be presented to Congress in opposition of the “Card Check” legislation being considered by them. The Board of Directors approved participating in this effort.



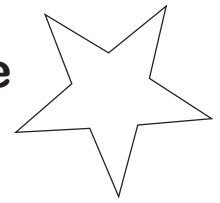
Organized labor’s top priority in Congress is a bill called the “Employee Free Choice Act.” The measure would dramatically change U.S. labor law. Today, employees are entitled to a private-ballot election when deciding whether they want union representation in their workplace. Elections are overseen by the National Labor Relations Board, which has numerous procedures in place to ensure fair, fraud-free elections. Because of NLRB safeguards, employees can cast their vote confidentially, without peer pressure or coercion from unions or employers.

If Congress passes the Employee Free Choice Act, employees effectively lose their right to private-ballot elections. The bill would establish a so-called “card-check” union organizing system, in which a majority of employees simply sign a card in favor of union representation.

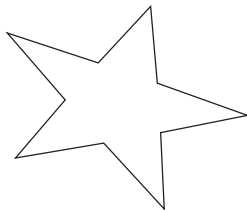

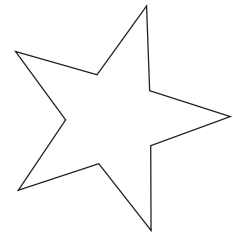

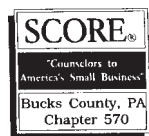
