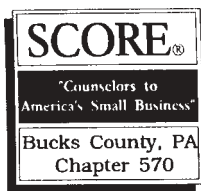

Remember to Register NOW to Vote

The November election is fast approaching, and if you or someone you know are not registered to vote, there is still time. It is an important election since we will be choosing the next president of the United States of America, and the direction the country will take.

First-time voters and new residents have until October 6 to register to vote in the November 4 General Election. Voters who are ill or who will be away from their designated voting districts on Election Day can vote by absentee ballot. The deadline to apply for an absentee ballot is October 28, and the County Board of Elections must receive ballots by October 31.

Voter registration forms or absentee ballot applications can be picked up at the Bucks County Courthouse, Doylestown, or at the Bucks County Government Services Center in Quakertown.
